- 1) Agriculture- with vast amounts of land suitable for crops and growing livestock, the Blood Tribe is expanding its agriculture offerings with value added opportunities such as Kanai Forage, a timothy hay exporter, and there are more opportunities like this.
- 2) Tourism- cultural tourism is growing within the Indigenous community and as one of the largest areas in Canada, the Blood Tribe has a lot to teach the world about history and its ways.

With a registered population of 12,879 tribal members, this is the primary labour pool for businesses. There are also neighboring municipalities including the City of Lethbridge where additional labour can be pulled in from. Talent that is drawn from the Blood Tribe is naturally retained due to the structure of the band and the fact that a substantial percentage of people live on the reserve. Is there access to post-secondary or training programs offered? (either in or around your region?)

The Blood Tribe runs two additional post-secondary training programs. Red Crow Community College is located on the reserve and has a satellite campus in Lethbridge and is open to the public and to tribal members. Blood Tribe Employment & Skills Training is a Tribal Department that provides various skilled training opportunities for individuals and businesses.

What are some notable stats about the local/regional workforce?

Stats Can Census 2021- 60% of the population is between the ages of 15-64 with the average age being 34.2, so a young workforce.

Alberta Regional Dashboard- 23% unemployment rate and 41% participation rate. The couple's family income on reserve is \$93,000.
